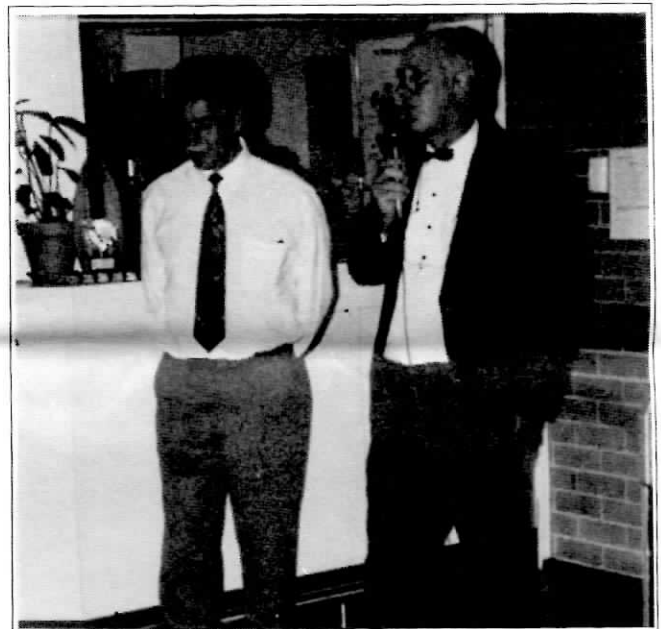

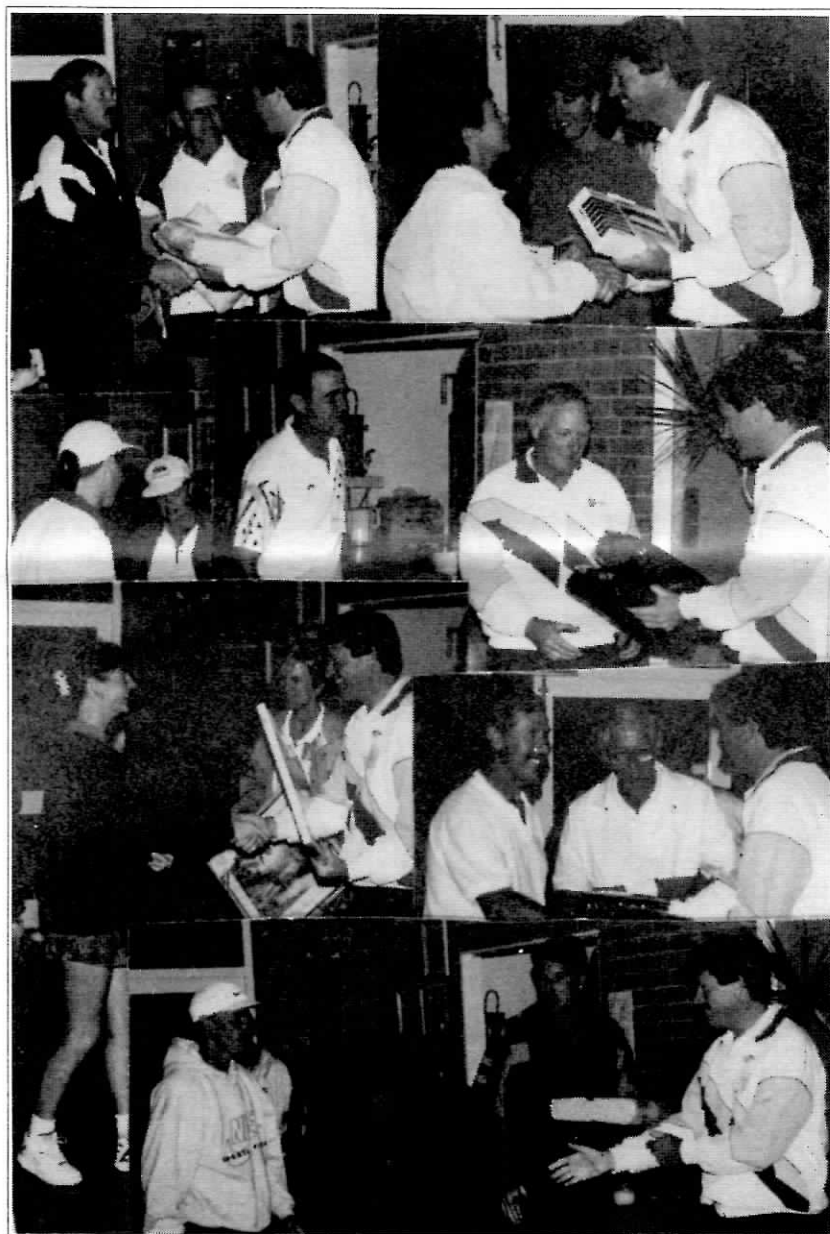

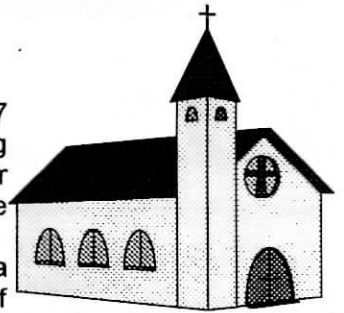
WEDDING BELLS FOR HENSMAN
